

# Abstract What You Love Objects • Florals • Landscapes with Nadine Johnson

## Supply List

Nadine will be demoing on cradled birch panels or canvas.

The list of supplies is a guideline of materials that you can bring. Nadine will be using a variety of these supplies in her demonstrations.

## Required Items

- Bring a snack or lunch. There will be a break.
- 2 to 3 cradled birch panels or canvas. If you work fast, you can bring a couple more. Any size is fine, but remember that we will be working in a group environment and need to respect each other's space. If you are working on birch panels, please prep them with gesso before class. 16" x 16" up to 24" x 24" would be great in landscape format, you could use 16"x 20" or 18" x 24"
- You can work on paper if you prefer. You can bring a sketchbook or loose mixed media paper cut into sizes from 12" x 12" up to 16" x 20"
- If you have a reference you would like to work from, please bring it. You can work intuitively if that is your preference; having an image can be a great way to start if you're uncertain where to begin.
- Tablecloth
- Palette paper or a palette to put your paint on
- Gel medium for collage
- Apron
- \*Acrylic paint, including black and white, is required - the list below is a guideline, choose some of your favourites
- Catalyst paint scraper or silicone bowl scraper - if you don't have this, you can use a credit card, palette knife, or any type of spatula
- 3 or 4 Paint brushes - a variety of sizes. An inexpensive "Chip" brush is good. You can buy them at any hardware store; Home Depot has them in the paint department.
- 1 new roll of blue shop paper towels
- Mark-making tools, pencils, chopsticks, scrapers, palette knife, stencils, cardboard cup holder, anything with a great texture
- Spray bottle
- Collage papers, or anything you would like to put in your painting. Old receipts, papers you've made or purchased, book pages, tissue paper, etc.

## Optional

- A notebook or paper to take notes on if you like
- Trowel - Nadine's favourite tool! You can get these at any local hardware store.
- Water-Based crayons - Stabilo Woody's are great
- Crayons
- Posca pens
- Acrylic markers
- Charcoal
- Brayer
- Blow dryer - good to have if you work fast
- Scissors

## \*Acrylic paints

A variety of colours would be good to bring. You can work with a limited palette as well. Pick 2 or 3 of your favorite colours and black and white. If you aren't sure what those are, you can ask the staff at any art store.
