Beginner Acrylic or Beginner Oil painting Classes

Welcome to your beginner painting art class. So happy that you are here!

Your paint, support (canvas or board), palette and all the other things you need are included for these classes!!!

Painting can sometimes be messy, if you have an apron or smock to bring, great. If you don't, *don't worry*, wear clothes that you don't mind getting a bit of paint on and everything will be fine.

What else to bring.....

Brushes:

Bring a selection of brushes that are a variety of sizes and shapes. Flat brushes (rectangle shape) are my favorite and smaller round brushes are handy for doing details. If you have a bunch of brushes at home already, bring them all and Holly will go through with you what will work best for this workshop.

Hogs' hair or synthetic brushes will work just fine.

Most art supply stores will have a **beginner set of brushes**, with a variety of sizes for either oil or acrylic. That would be a fantastic and inexpensive way to start ;)

- **We will need 3 flat brushes that are:**

$\frac{1}{2}$ ", $\frac{3}{4}$ " & 1" wide

- **And 1 small round brush** for details

If you know that you're into painting and want to invest in something better than a beginner set, below are a few suggestions of sizes and brands that I really like to work with.

Paint brush brands:

For Acrylic (*synthetic brushes*): White Taklon, Princeton 6300, Interlon, Rosemary (synthetic)

For Oil (*Synthetic or Hogs Hair brushes*): Princeton 6300, Rosemary (synthetic or hogs hair) or H.J blue handle brushes are my faveorite.

- Flat brushes Size #2, 4, 8, 10, (every other number is usually a great variety of sizes to work with)
- Small white taklon round #0 or #1 for details

Please also bring:

Pencil/ pen

Sketch book / note pad for notes

Oil painters: Small glass jar for solvent (old jam jars are great)
